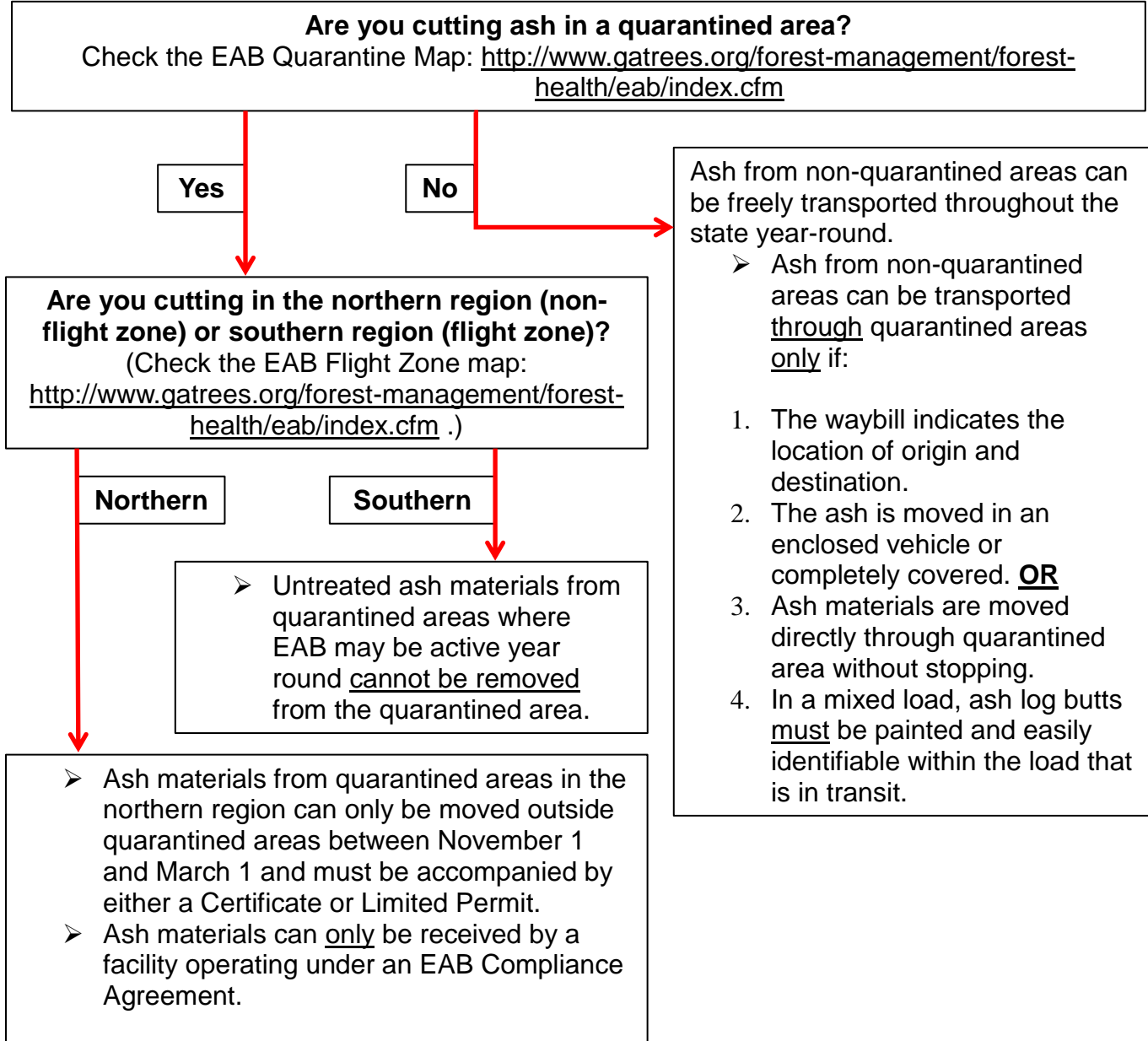
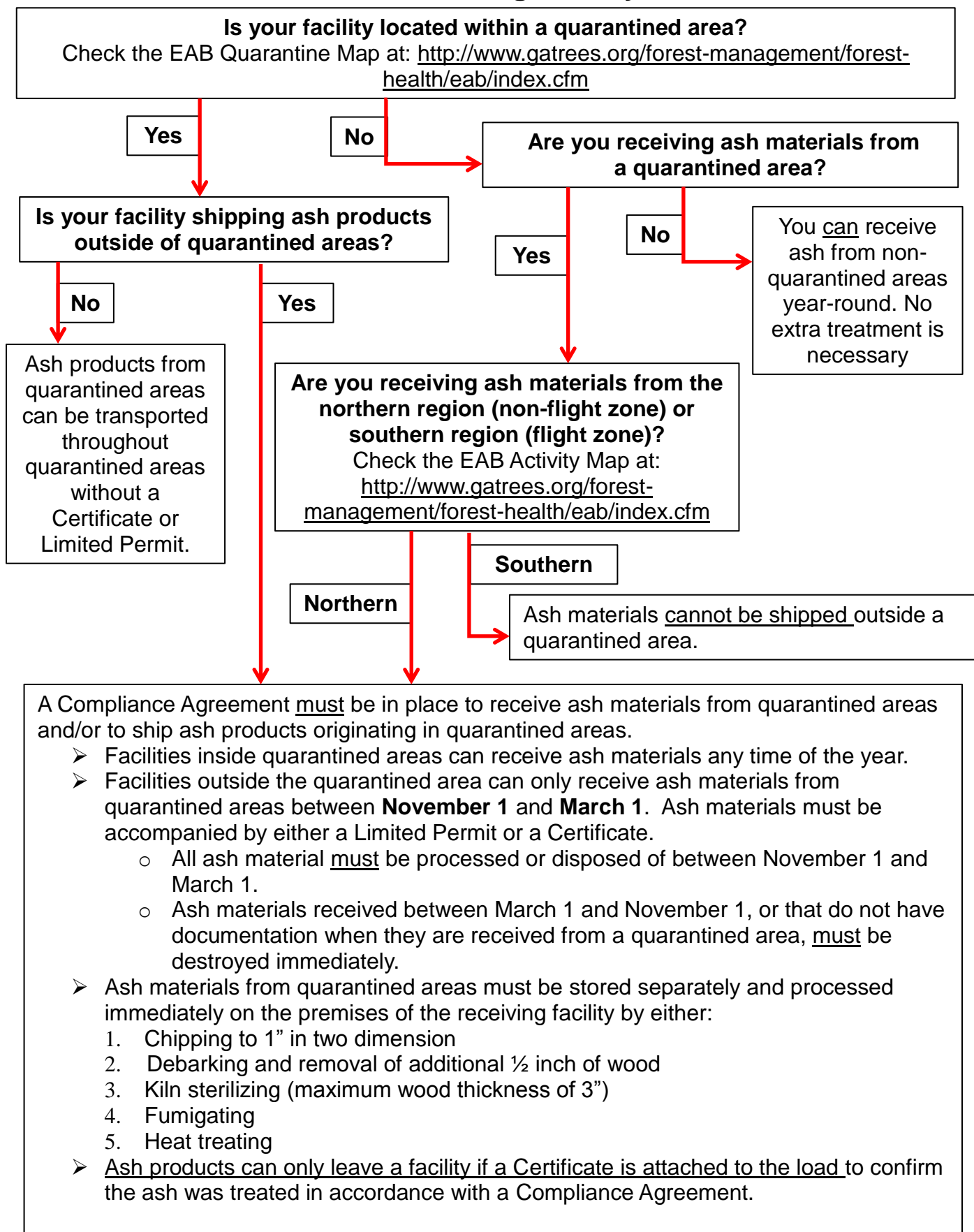


Emerald Ash Borer Flow Chart

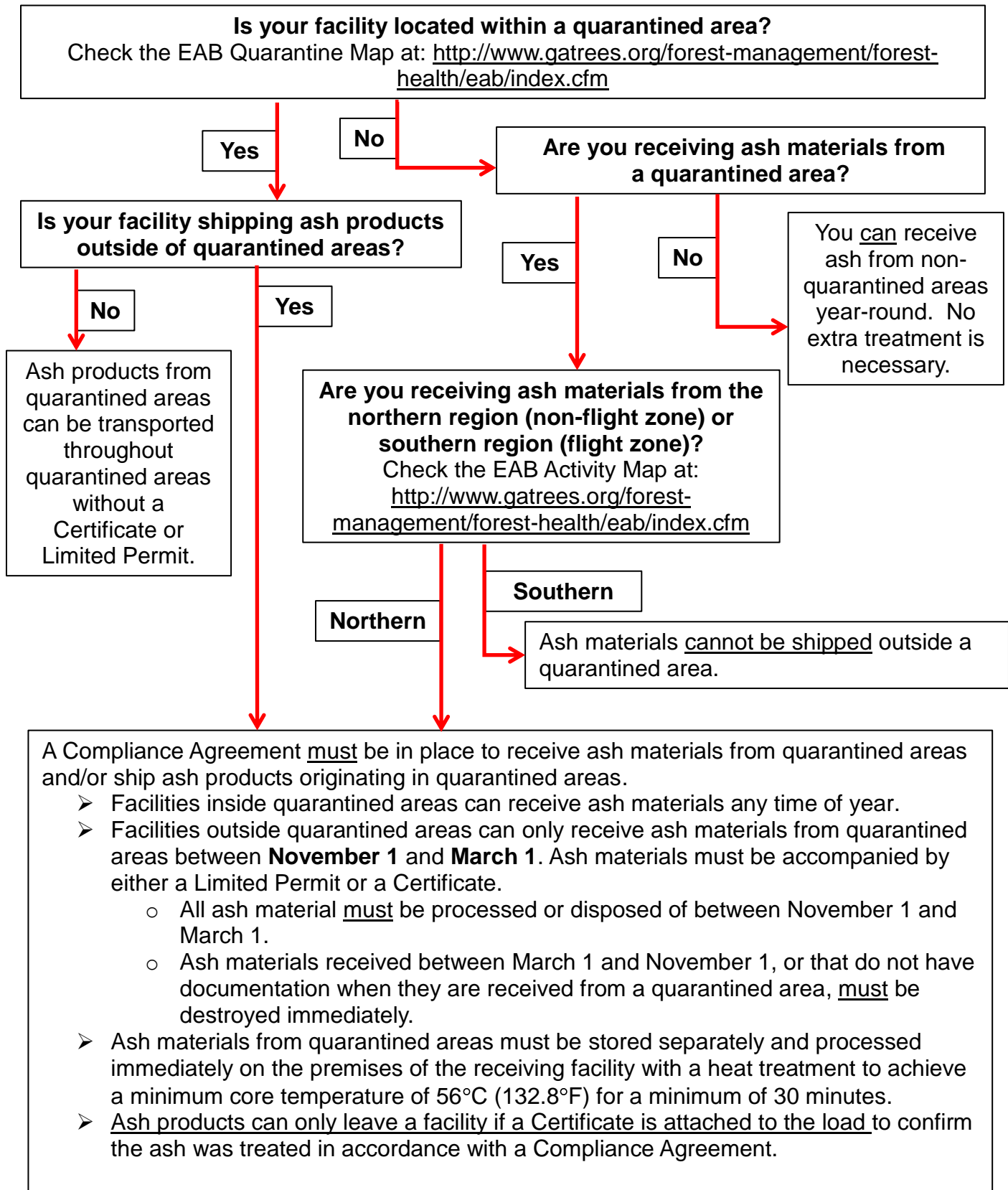
Cutting Ash



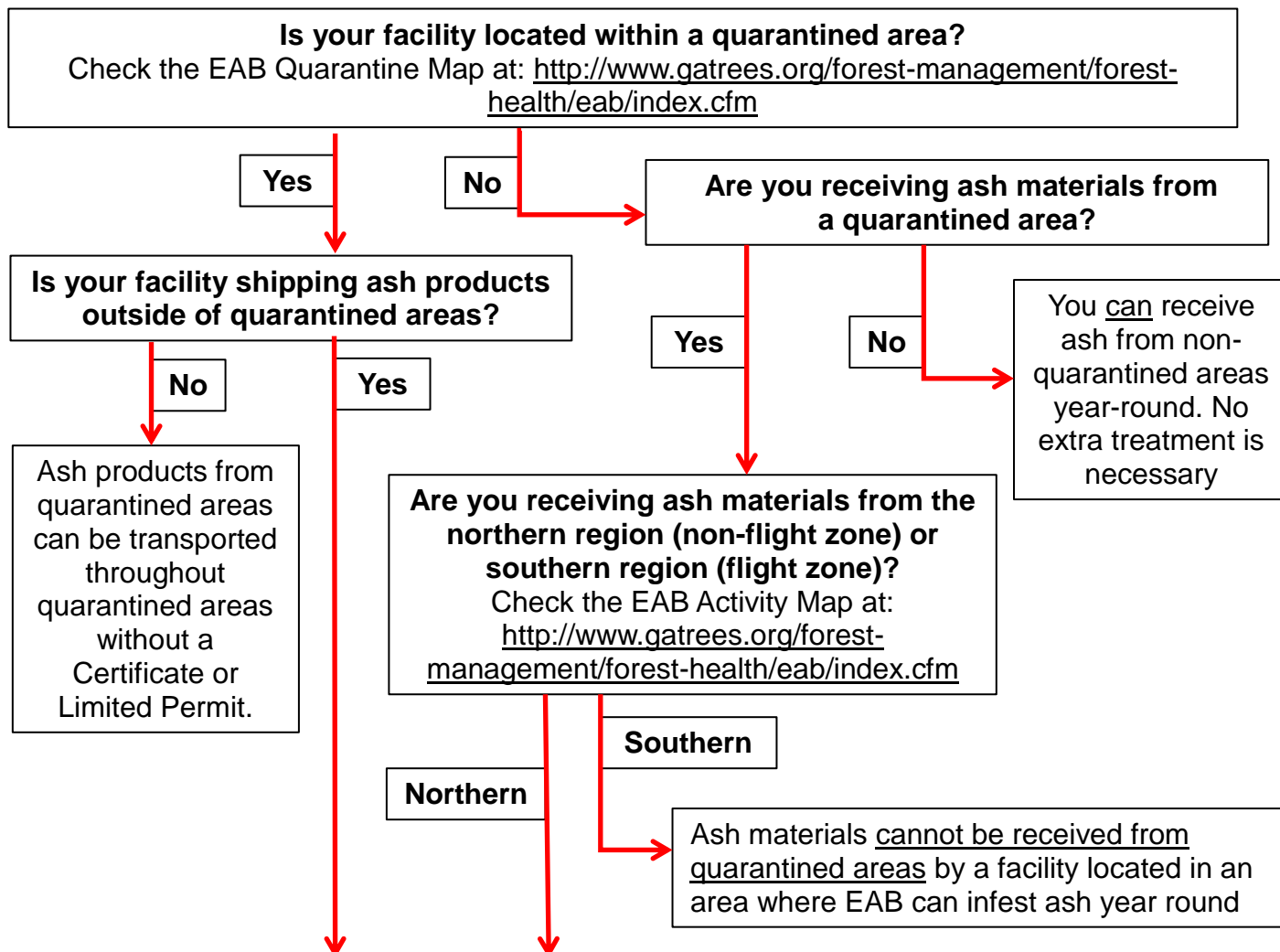
Processing Facility

Mulch or Waste Facility Receiving or Shipping



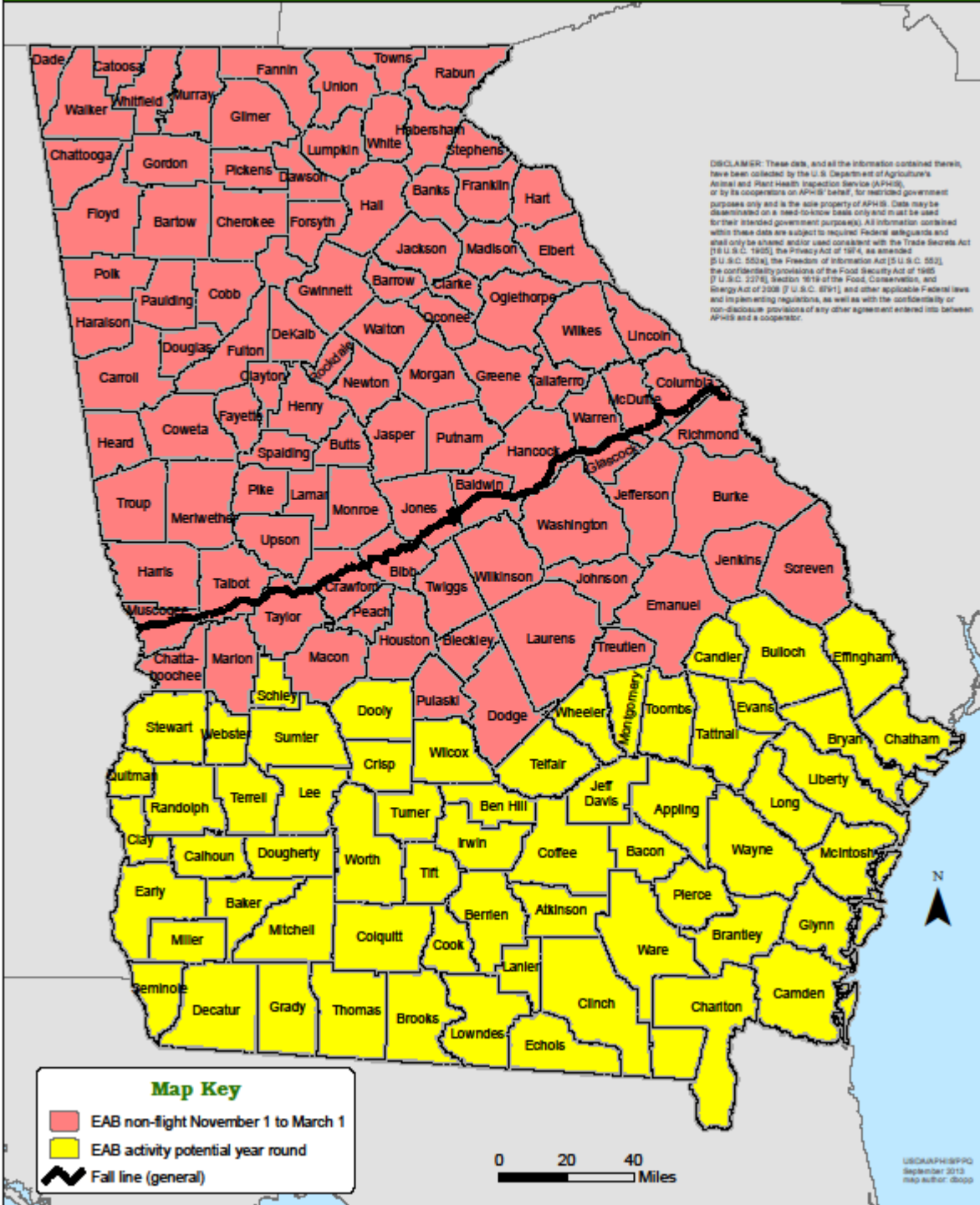
A Compliance Agreement must be in place to receive ash materials from quarantined areas and/or ship ash products originating in quarantined areas.

- Facilities inside quarantined areas can receive ash materials any time of year.
- Facilities outside quarantined areas can only receive ash materials from quarantined areas between **November 1** and **March 1**. Ash materials must be accompanied by either a Limited Permit or a Certificate.
 - All ash material must be processed or disposed of between November 1 and March 1.
 - Ash materials received between March 1 and November 1, or that do not have documentation when they are received from a quarantined area, must be destroyed immediately.
- Ash materials from quarantined areas must be stored separately and processed immediately on the premises of the receiving facility by either:
 1. Chipping to 1" in two dimensions
 2. Composting
- Ash products can only leave a facility if a Certificate is attached to the load to confirm the ash was treated in accordance with a Compliance Agreement.
