

Timber Damage Assessment

Date: April 5-6, 2022

Subject: Tornado event throughout SW, Central, and SE Georgia

Description of the Event: On Tuesday April 5th and Wednesday April 6th, a strong storm system produced multiple tornadoes, mainly across Central and South Georgia. Georgia Forestry Commission management foresters and GIS foresters helped assess and map out the damage that occurred throughout the state. There were 25 tornado touch downs, with seven of the tornadoes causing timber damage that required an assessment.

Total Value of Timber Damaged - \$1,888,832
Total Cost to Reforest Damaged Area - \$778,222.50
