**This TIMBER HARVEST CONTRACT (the "CONTRACT")** is made and entered into by and between the **GEORGIA FORESTRY COMMISSION**, 5645 Riggins Mill Rd, Dry Branch, GA 31020, hereinafter referred to as the **"SELLER"** and

"BUYER".

WITNESSETH:

**ARTICLE I. Obligations of the SELLER:**

1. Agrees to sell to the BUYER all those forest products to be harvested as defined here, and hereby represents and warrants it has good and unencumbered title to such timber:
  - a) Location and Description of Sale Area  
The timber sale area, approximately 207.69 acres, is located approximately ten (10) miles south east of Waycross, GA on the Georgia Forestry Commission's Dixon Memorial State Forest. The clear cut areas are bounded by three diagonal blue or yellow lines and hardwood swamps and bays. The specific sites are designated on the attached maps as Exhibits "B", "C", "D", "E", "F", "G", "H", "I", "J", "K", & "L" which are incorporated herein by reference and made part of this CONTRACT and which are herein collectively referred to as the "PROPERTY".
  - b) Method of Harvesting Forest Products  
Timber shall be harvested according to specific instructions found in "Timber Harvest Specifications", Article III, Paragraph 1.
2. Seller agrees to grant to the BUYER the right of ingress and egress across and upon the property for the purpose of carrying out forest products harvesting identified in this CONTRACT.
3. Shall in no way assume any responsibility for damage to equipment belonging to the BUYER or injury to persons employed by the BUYER or his/her agent; said responsibility being totally assumed by the BUYER.
4. 7. Agrees to pay the SELLER a performance bond equal to **\$(10% of estimated total sale price)** upon the execution of this CONTRACT. The Performance Bond will be returned to the BUYER less any damages as determined by the terms within this CONTRACT. The SELLER shall have up to sixty (60) days from the expiration or earlier termination of this CONTRACT to inspect the property and account to the BUYER for any balance due it from the Performance Bond.
8. Agrees to harvest the entire sale area within eighteen (18) months of execution of this CONTRACT (the "CONTRACT PERIOD") unless wet weather prevents/delays harvest. If harvesting operations are delayed or suspended due to weather conditions, as determined by SELLER, time lost will be added to the CONTRACT PERIOD. In the event the BUYER is unable to harvest within the CONTRACT PERIOD, as it may be extended by agreement or weather conditions, the BUYER will forfeit the Performance Bond.
9. Will prior to the execution of this CONTRACT, provide to the SELLER proof of Worker's Compensation insurance coverage for all his/her employees and/or his/her agent's employees who will be performing work and General Liability insurance with limits of one million dollars/two million dollar aggregate; such coverage to be maintained throughout the CONTRACT PERIOD.
10. Will repair to original condition or pay for cost of replacement, any damage caused by the BUYER, to fences, roads or other improvements of the SELLER.
11. Will be responsible for construction and cost of necessary road work.
12. Will immediately notify SELLER of any wildfires and will reimburse the SELLER for all costs borne by

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the SELLER in suppressing any wildfires or cost of wildfire damages incurred or caused by the BUYER or his/her agent upon lands subject to this CONTRACT.

13. Will indemnify, release, and hold the SELLER, the STATE OF GEORGIA, its various other units of government, its instrumentalities, and all officers, employees, and agents of the foregoing, harmless from and against all liabilities, damages, costs, expenses (including all attorney's fees and expenses incurred by them), causes of action, suits, demands, judgments, and claims of any nature whatsoever, arising from, by reason of or in connection with the operations hereunder; provided, however, no indemnity shall be indemnified for the results of that indemnitee's sole negligence or, in the case of multiple negligence, for the share caused by the indemnitee's negligence.
14. Will remove all garbage, used lubricant, fuel, fluids and their containers daily, as a result of the BUYER's work involving this CONTRACT.
15. Buyer agrees to attend pre-harvest mandatory meeting with SELLER on site prior to beginning of harvest operations.
16. Will give two (2) days' notice prior to commencing logging activity and prior to completion of harvesting and removal of logging equipment.

### ARTICLE III. BOTH PARTIES MUTUALLY AGREE:

1. The following work specifications are applicable and will be adhered to by the BUYER unless changes are approved in writing by the SELLER.
  - Timber Harvest Specifications
  - a. For detailed timber harvest specifications, see Exhibit "A" Timber Harvest Plan.
  - b. All standing merchantable timber (pine and hardwood) within the designated areas shall be clear cut. Hardwoods four (4) inches in diameter breast height (DBH) and larger must be cut and taken off site or piled with other un-merchantable limbs and tops.
  - c. Pine stumps shall be not more than six (6) inches above the original ground level or immediately above any butt swell, whichever is higher. Hardwood stumps shall be not more than eight (8) inches above the original ground level or immediately above any butt swell, whichever is higher.
  - d. Any and all harvest slash, un-merchantable limbs and tops within the clear cut stand which do not meet specifications for chipping, will be left in manageable piles, as is within reason, to help facilitate future burning. Piles must be at a distance from standing trees so as not to cause damage to those trees when burned. Within the thinning stand, this harvest slash will be evenly distributed back within the stand.
  - e. "Brows" or "Loading Decks" (locations proposed on Exhibits "B", "C", "D", "E", "F", "G", "H", "I", "J", "K", & "L") will be placed a specified distance from roads or highways to prevent visual contact of these areas. Decks shall be agreed upon by the BUYER and the SELLER prior to construction.
  - f. Excessive damage to residual trees will be compensated for by the BUYER. The BUYER shall be charged at the rate of three (3) times the forest product prices found in the latest edition of Timber Mart South and charged against the performance bond described in Article 2, condition 2. Excessive damage will be determined by the SELLER.
2. Wood Flow Accounting Procedures – The SELLER will provide the BUYER with load tickets which will operate as a security device and record for the timber cut under this CONTRACT. These load tickets will be subsequently numbered documents in multiple part forms. The BUYER will be responsible for completing the pertinent information on the form for each load, attaching one part (section 3) of the load ticket to the load of timber at the loading site, and depositing another part of the ticket (section 2) into a lock box at the site provided for by the SELLER. Section 1 of the load ticket will be kept in the ticket book by the BUYER. The BUYER shall have the loads weighed across any state certified or forest products industry scale, with the scale weight recorded on a written scale

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ticket. The BUYER shall attach (section 4) of the load ticket to the corresponding scale ticket for each week's deliveries, with a cutting report and sales record recapping the timber types, weights and payment classifications and shall be mailed on a weekly basis to Georgia Forestry Commission 5003 Jacksonville Hwy, Waycross, GA 31503, Attn: Matthew Mrizek. Spot checks will be made by the SELLER in the field to make sure trailers are tagged properly. If the BUYER fails to produce load tickets and scale tickets that correspond to all load tickets used and deposited in the lock box, the BUYER shall pay the SELLER for each missing ticket at the rate of 24 tons of the highest value product in Article I. Any load tickets issued to the BUYER which are unused at completion of the sale must be returned to the SELLER. The BUYER is responsible for load tickets \_\_\_\_\_ through \_\_\_\_\_ for this CONTRACT.

3. If either party fails to cure any breach (including, without limitation, failure to make a payment when due or adhere to BMPs) within 30 days after written notice, the other party may suspend performance or terminate the CONTRACT and exercise any other legal rights or remedies.

The SELLER reserves the right to perform periodic inspections to determine whether or not the terms of this CONTRACT are being achieved and to suspend operation when weather conditions may result in damage to the site, until conditions improve. Timber Harvest inspection form is attached as Exhibit "M".
5. The CONTRACT shall terminate when the BUYER receives a release of escrow letter from SELLER stating timber harvest activities are satisfactorily completed or eighteen (18) months from CONTRACT date, whichever first occurs, unless the CONTRACT is extended due to weather or the parties agree to an extension of time for removal of forest products covered under this CONTRACT.
6. No oral statement by any person shall be allowed to modify or change any written portion of this CONTRACT.
7. This CONTRACT shall not be assigned by the BUYER in whole or in part without the written consent of the SELLER. The SELLER shall approve, in writing, any new Buyer to the CONTRACT or any Buyer that is not named as the BUYER to this CONTRACT.
8. Any designated forest products, harvested or un-harvested, which remain on the sale area at the date this CONTRACT terminates, remain the property of the SELLER.
9. The parties agree that this CONTRACT is subject to the authority of the Georgia Forestry Commission, pursuant to O.C.G.A 12-6-6, to manage State Forest lands and to oversee the sale of timber and other forest products grown on such lands.
10. This CONTRACT shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of Georgia. The Superior Court of Fulton County shall have exclusive jurisdiction over any and all actions, suits, or other proceedings instituted to enforce the CONTRACT unless SELLER, in writing, decides that a different court has jurisdiction.

**Harvest Area Description:**

This per ton timber harvest consists of a clearcut of approximately 207.69 acres of planted pine. The stands to be harvested have the following breakdown:

- Within the Clearcut area, all merchantable timber should be removed. The stand boundary is marked by roads and firebreaks. Boundary trees for the clearcut area is marked with blue or yellow paint with a “\\” pattern and should be left unless they have an “X” on them.
- There is a very large remnant slash pine in 38D. Avoid harvesting or damaging the tree. It has been marked on 4 sides with 3 “\\” lines. It also has large nail driven through it.
- Avoid dropping any tree or debris in firebreaks or roads.
- Skidding across roads should be avoided and should be preapproved by Dixon Memorial State Forest Personnel if deemed necessary.
- **Rutting in the stands must be avoided.**
- If healthy trees exist around gates, then leave them to block traffic from driving around.
- Do not skid down the Fiber Optic ROW. The Fiber Optic ROW can be used as a haul road only when dry. Rutting must be avoided to prevent damage to the fiber optic line.

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### **Streams & Wetlands**

- Avoid crossing any streams unless approved by Dixon Memorial State Forest personnel.
- Appropriate SMZs should be left on all intermittent and perennial streams.
- There are numerous wet depressions throughout the stands where rutting should be avoided.

### **Logging Decks & Logging Slash**

- Proposed log deck locations as indicated on sale maps are the preferred locations but deviation is allowed if approved by Dixon Memorial State Forest personnel.
- Log decks which are located adjacent to food plots should be placed within the stand but on the edge to extend the size of the food plot.
- Log decks should not be excessively large.
- Loggers are encouraged to use the minimum number of decks possible.
- Decks should be placed far enough off roads to avoid impacting roads.
- Do not trim trailers in the roads.
- All hardwoods with a DBH of 4" and larger should be cut and moved to the deck or taken off site.
- Logging slash should be moved into manageable piles at least 250 feet away from any standing timber, sale boundary, or property line so as to help facilitate future burning of these piles.
- Remove logging slash from roads and road ditches once a stand is harvested.

### **Roads**

- Access to the stands can be gained through various state forest roads and county roads.
- Temporary road construction is allowed once approved by Dixon Memorial State Forest personnel and must adhere to BMPs.

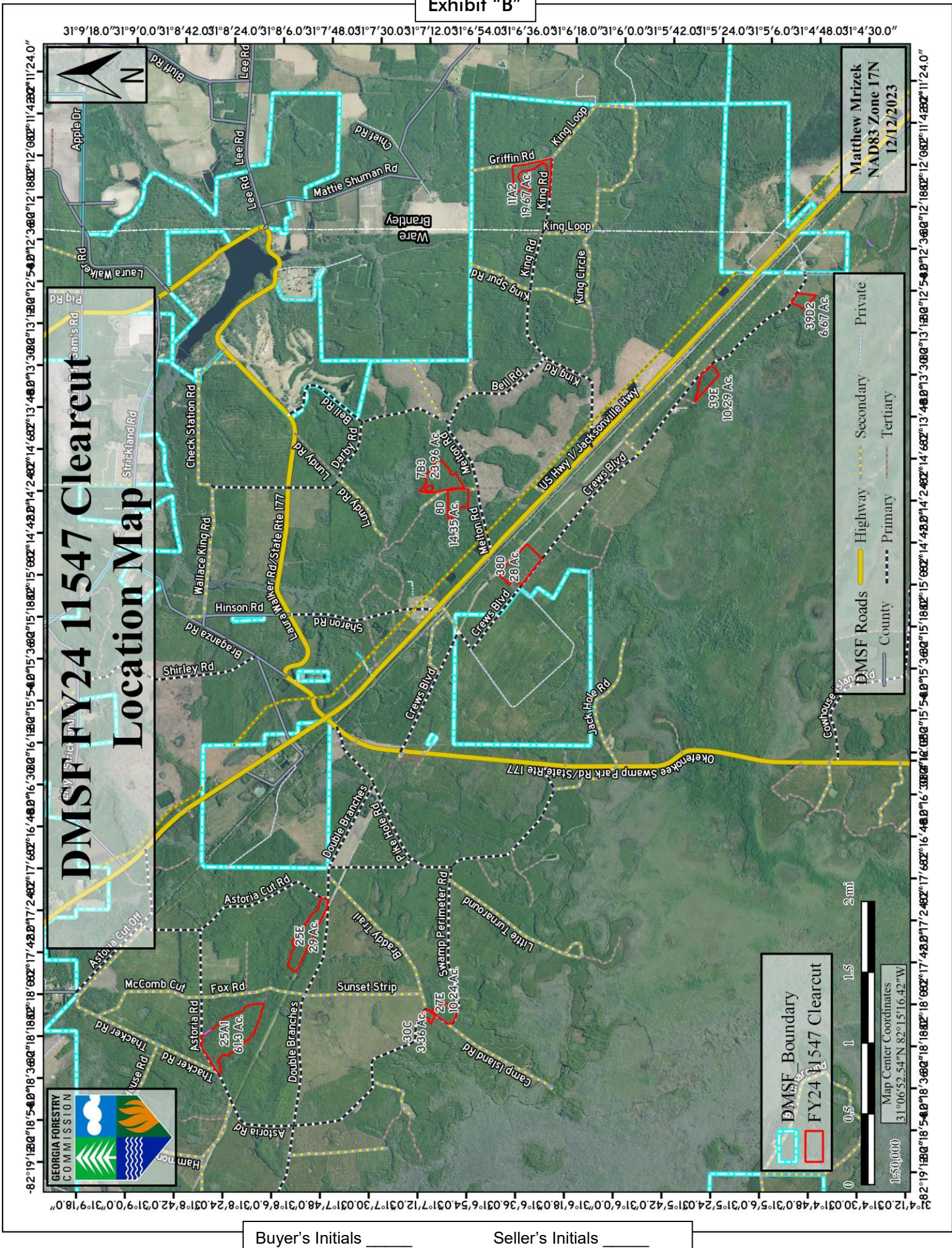
